

Cat Grooming

Cats spend at least five hours a day grooming and cleaning themselves but they do need some human help as well! Get your cat used to being combed and brushed at an early age and he will soon enjoy this part of the day. Long-haired cats obviously need more care and attention than the shorter-haired ones to make sure their coats do not become matted.



- Many people do not think of grooming a cat the same way they would a dog. Cats are very clean by nature, but it is important to pay attention to their grooming needs also. We recommend that you brush or comb your cat at least once a week, especially if your cat has long hair. This will prevent matting of the fur and also reduce shedding. If you begin a grooming routine at home when the cat is a kitten, they will become more familiar with it.
- Cat's nails need to be clipped on a regular basis also. If a cat's nails get too long they can get caught on things, like your carpet. You can do it at home with a cat nail clipper. If you are reluctant to do it yourself, then take the cat to your vet or a groomer.
- You can also use dry foam shampoo on your cat as well.
